

Alabama Pathways Professional Development Registry

ALL licensed centers are required to register for face-to-face classes through the Alabama Pathways

Professional Development Registry website.

To find classes that are to be offered in Region 1 follow the following steps:

- 1. Login to your Alabama Pathways account at www.alabamapathways.org
 - 2. Choose "My Calendar"
 - 3. Choose "Search Training"
 - 4. Under "REGION" Choose Huntsville

(for all counties in Region 1) Do not enter anything more in the search areas.

- 5. Choose "Search"
- 6. Scroll down and you will find a list of classes.
- 7. Any class that Child Care Central is conducting will have a title that starts as "Child Care Central Presents"

- 9. If you want to attend that class, scroll down to find the "register" button.

Strengthening Business Practices Series

Strengthening Business Practices

This training series, of 4 modules, addresses basic concepts in fiscal and operational management of center-based child care programs. These trainings are grounded in the belief that strong and sustainable child care businesses can support program incentives aimed at improving outcomes for children. These trainings are intended to be one part of the learning process to build providers, understanding of good business practices. Whenever possible, it is recommended that these trainings be supplemented with technical assistance and ongoing peer-to-peer sharing opportunities such as communities of practice.

Module I: Budgets, Projections, and Planning

The objectives for this module are to:

Learn the value of developing a budget and how to use it for decision making throughout the year.

Understand how to project business costs, generate additional income and plan strategically for future goals.

Module II: Financial Reports and Internal Controls

The objectives for this module are to:

Understand financial reports and their use is fiscal management.

Identify internal controls and how they can strengthen the fiscal health of a family child care program.

Module III: Marketing Your Program for Center Based Child Care Providers

The purpose of this training is to strengthen child care provider's understanding of marketing tools, audiences, and elements necessary to develop a marketing plan. It encourages providers to tailor marketing practices to the audience they are trying to reach and to develop effective communication strategies to promote their services.

Module IV: Recruiting and Retaining Staff for Center Based Child Care Providers

The purpose of this training is to strengthen child care providers' understanding of staff recruitment tools, organizational staff support systems, and elements necessary to support retention of talented staff.

Infant/Toddler Track

Training sessions offered this quarter:

Foundations of Early Literacy: Building Skills for Lifelong Learning

Basic DHR: LD; CDA: 2; CKA: CGD, LEE; ASELD: LLT; CCDF: 13; QRIS: N/A
This training is designed to equip early childhood educators with the knowledge and strategies needed to foster early literacy skills in young children. Participants will explore key concepts in language development, phonemic awareness, and building vocabulary.

Let's Focus on the 3 R's: Relationships, Repetition, and Routines

Basic; DHR: CCPF; CDA: 3, 4; CKA: CGD, LEE; CCDF: 13, 20; ASELD: SED; QRIS: 5

Nurturing responsive relationships is the foundation for early learning and building brain development. Infants and toddlers have thousands of interactions each day from the time they are born to the time they enter a childcare center. They interact with their caregivers, teachers, and other children to name a few. In this class we will focus on ways to promote positive and consistent interactions while supporting brain development and their learning.

Meeting the Needs of Infants and Toddlers

Intermediate; DHR-HSUP, CD; CDA-1, 2, 3, 8; CKA-HSN, LEE; CCDF-13, 20; ASELD-PDH; QRIS-1, 5;

Safety is more than just making sure physical spaces and materials are appropriate for infants and toddlers. It is creating a supportive space that is both nurturing yet stimulating, encouraging infants and toddlers to explore, learn, and grow. A supportive responsive environment combines children's needs and interests in a hazard-free but intriguing setting. The atmosphere must convey that they are respected, safe, capable, and special to the adults in their lives. This training will suggest appropriate practices that will engage them and invite learning.

But are they Safe?

Intermediate; DHR: QCCL; CDA: 1; CKA: CGD, LEE; CCDF: 13, 20; ASELD: SED; QRIS: 6.9C, 6.10A, 6.10B

Children cannot learn if their basic needs are not met first. It is important for children to know that they are safe, especially those little ones that rely solely on an adult for everything. We spend a lot of time making sure that we are meeting learning goals, but are the kids safe? We will focus on making sure that you can recognize potential hazards in your infant and toddler classrooms and ways that we can improve the physical environment.

Preschool Track

Training sessions offered this quarter:

APT: Playing It Safe: How to Create Safe Spaces

Basic; DHR: CD; CDA: 1, 3, 8; CKA: CDG, LEE; CCDF: 13, 15,16

We are living in a day and time where creating safe spaces for children is a vital part of the learning environment. Come along with us as we discuss the elements of a safe space and ways to effectively create those spaces for young children.

APT: More than 1, 2, 3...What is Early Numeracy?

Basic; DHR: CD; CDA: 8; CKA: CGD, LEE; CCDF: 13; ASELD: MAT; QRIS:1

Through engaging in hands-on activities, participants will learn that early numeracy is more than counting. This 2-hour training will provide ideas and concepts that support children as they explore patterns, problem solving and estimation while utilizing PBS KIDS resources and children's books.

It's a Jungle in Here

BASIC; DHR: CD; CKA: CGD; CDA:1; CCDF: 13; ASELD: PDH; QRIS: 5

A toddler's classroom can sometimes resemble a jungle sometimes. There's running, fighting, swinging and biting. I'm just talking about the children. In the training, in this training, participants will identify ways they can keep the children safe while giving them what they need that is developmentally appropriate for their age group.

Affirmations Lead to Success: Positive Discipline Techniques

Basic; DHR: PDG; CDA: 1, 2; CKA: CGD, LEE; CCDF: 13, 15; ASELD: SED; QRIS: 1 Testing boundaries and misbehaving is a natural part of growing up. Although it is difficult to deal with, teachers must find ways to provide positive discipline and guidance while keeping children in their care safe. In this class we will learn ways to help children develop valuable skills for life by setting clear expectations, teach emotional regulation skills, and use positive reinforcement by modeling appropriate behavior to create a supportive classroom environment.

APT: Life's Little Lessons

Basic; DHR: CD; CDA:1,3; CKA: CGD, LEE; CCDF:13,16

In today's world, young children must learn how to navigate separation anxiety and how to become persistent, understanding why being alike and being different is okay and embracing new experiences. Through hands-on activities and PBSKids series and resources, we will learn ways to build and support these life's little lessons.

School-Age Track

Training sessions offered this quarter:

What is the Purpose of School-Age Care?

Intermediate; DHR-QCCL; CKA-CGD, LEE; CDA-1; CCDF-19

School-age care is a place for growth, nurturing, and life skill development. Everyday children and youth experiment with at-risk behaviors and begin negative developmental pathways. The school-age care professional can be a powerful force for a child's growth.

Yes, We Accept School-Age Children. Now What Do We Do With Them?
Basic; DHR: CCPF; CDA: 1, 2, 3; CKA: CGD, LEE; CCDF: 19; ASELD: SED, APL; QRIS: 1

In this class we will focus on what to do in a program that provides care to school age children. We will discuss ways to create a program that supports their development and social skills while maintaining age-appropriateness and creating a fun learning environment.

APT: What's in Your Community?

Our communities are made of many service providers. In this training, we will discuss who those service providers are, how they serve the community and why they are important. So, come along with us as we learn about our community service providers.



Director Track

Are All Your Ducks in a Row?

Childcare directors are tasked with a multitude of things throughout the day. They must keep their composure through the good, bad, ugly, oh my, and the occasional I think the ship is sinking. This class will focus on the mental health of directors and strategies to cope through difficult times.

Supervising Staff

Intermediate; DHR-AM, QCCL; CDA- 5, 6; CKA- MA, PPD; CCDF-13,18; ASELD-APL; QRIS-1, 4, 6;

Working relationships are an important part of a childcare program. Supervising your staff is a means of helping them develop their professional skills and serve the children well. Consequently, becoming a coach or mentor to your staff can strengthen relationships boosting morale, increasing engagement, and creating high-performing staff members. Understanding the nuances of coaching and mentoring can help you better implement the different methods as well as improve the supervisory relationship you have with your staff.

APT: Different Leadership Styles: What is My Style?

Basic; DHR: AM, CCPF; CDA; 5, 6; CKA; CGD, LEE; CCDF:13, 20; ASELD: SED; QRIS: 6

What type of leader are you? How can you strengthen your leadership practices? Why doesn't this one leadership style work for you? In this training, we will explore these questions, and many others, through discussions and demonstrations.

Training for ALL Tracks

Training sessions offered this quarter:

Basics in Child Care

Being an early childhood educator requires you to be willing to wear many hats. As a new educator, remember that your job description may change on a daily basis. As an early childhood educator, you will be challenged to find new experiences to share with children. Basics in Child Care will guide educators through six fundamental areas of early childhood development to prepare them for caring for children, to be knowledgeable of child development, resourceful in planning activities, skilled in guiding behavior, and able to maintain healthy environments.

To meet the requirements given for facilities participating in the Child Care Subsidy Program, we offer CCDF Areas together in 2 hour training sessions. CCDF 9 is available via our E-learning site.

CCDF Areas 1 & 3: Prevention & Control of Infectious Diseases/Administration of Medication

CCDF Areas 2 & 6: SIDS & Safe Sleep Practices/Shaken Baby Syndrome & Abusive Head Trauma

CCDF Areas 4 & 7: Emergencies Due to Food & Allergic Reactions/Emergency Preparedness

CCDF Areas 5 & 8: Building & Physical Premises Safety/Handling & Storage of Hazardous Materials

CCDF Areas 10 & 11: Child Abuse & Neglect/First Aid

How to Talk to Parents

Basic; DHR: PDG; CKA: ICFC; CDA:1, 4; CCDF: 13, 16; ASELD-FCE; QRIS-3;

Children do better in childcare when parents are involved in their education. Come learn effective strategies for involving parents in the early childhood program and in their child's learning.

Stop Procrastinating and Let's Get Started!

Immediate; DHR: AM, HSUP; CKA: HSN; CDA: 1,5; CCDF:1-11; ASELD: PDH; QRIS: 6;

I know that you have great ideas for your facility but getting them implemented is another story. We will learn ways to set up goals in reaching them in a timely manner.

Building Up for Quality

The purpose of the Building Up for Quality initiative is to reach out to early childhood education directors with the following questions:

- 1. What do you think your teachers might need?
- 2. How can we build up your teachers, and not tear them down?

We will work side-by-side with center directors and classroom teachers. The director will give CCC staff a professional development plan for their staff. We will then prepare for aiding the classroom teachers and building them up for higher quality services.

CCC staff will visit and observe classrooms, as requested by directors.

The teacher will be given a 2-question evaluation. After observing the classroom, CCC staff will demonstrate/model appropriate classroom behavior/management techniques.

The teacher will then be given the opportunity to demonstrate what they have learned. CCC staff will continue to work with the teacher as they, along with the director and teacher, feel necessary. The evaluation will be given again at the end of the session.

Each session will count as a 1-hour training for the classroom teacher, and they will receive a professional development certificate that meets DHR Performance Standards.

*Important Update Regarding Alabama Pathways

On June 17, 2024, Alabama Pathways, also known as the Professional Development Registry (PDR) website went back online. All licensed facilities MUST register for classes through Alabama Pathways. Any certificates obtained from June 1, 2023 to now MUST be uploaded to Alabama Pathways. Child Care Central will no longer give printed certificates for trainings to licensed facilities. Certificates will be available on the PDR within 48 business hours of the training date.
