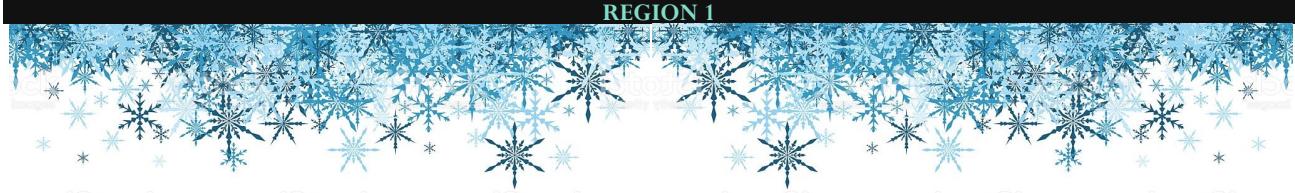

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Building Up for Quality

The purpose of this initiative is to reach out to early childhood education directors with the following questions:

1. What do you think your teachers might need?

2. How can we build up your teachers, and not tear them down?

We will work side-by-side with center directors and classroom teachers. The director will give CCC staff a professional development plan for their staff. We will then prepare for adding the classroom teachers and building them up for higher quality services.

CCC staff will visit and observe classrooms, as requested by directors. The teacher will be given a 2 question evaluation. After observing the classroom, CCC staff will demonstrate/model appropriate classroom behavior/management techniques. The teacher will then be given the opportunity to demonstrate what they have learned.

CCC staff will continue to work with the teacher as they, along with the director and teacher, feel necessary. An evaluation will be given at the end of the session. Each session will count as a 1-hour training for the classroom teacher, and they will receive a professional development certificate that meets DHR Performance Standards.

Circle Time • Transitions • Room Arrangement • Serve and Return/Meaningful Conversations • Potty Time • Behavior Management/Redirecting • Voice Tone/Saying Words That Encourage and Not Discourage • Process Vs. Product

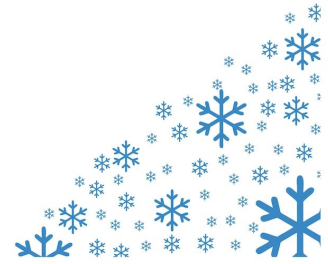
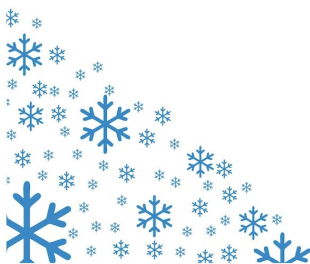

Alabama Pathways Professional Development Registry

ALL licensed centers are required to register for face-to-face classes through the Alabama Pathways Professional Development Registry website.

To find classes that are to be offered in Region 1 follow the following steps:

1. Login to your Alabama Pathways account at www.alabamapathways.org
2. Choose "My Calendar"
3. Choose "Search Training"
4. Under "REGION" Choose Huntsville
(for all counties in Region 1) Do not enter anything more in the search areas.
5. Choose "Search"
6. Scroll down and you will find a list of classes.
7. Any class that Child Care Central is conducting will have a title that starts as "Child Care Central Presents"
Session Name/ID is the county where the training will be located.
8. Under Action click the notepad icon to see the course information.
9. If you want to attend that class, scroll down to find the "register" button.

Child Care Central no longer gives printed certificates. They will be added to your Alabama Pathways account within 48 business hours of your class date. Any eLearning classes that you take with CCC must be saved and uploaded to Alabama Pathways by the participant.

Infant/Toddler:

Using Music to Interact with Infants

Have you ever wondered how important music is to development? Learn about ways that music can and does foster developmental growth in infants and toddlers. You can also learn ways to incorporate more music into your programs daily to help foster child development.

What's Going On In That Little Brain?

This lesson will stress the importance of positive interactions and describe effective responses to challenging behaviors. It will also provide information on working with families around supporting their child's behavior.

Directors are tasked with establishing and maintaining an educational yet professional learning environment. They must communicate with teachers, guardians, and students. This class will focus on effective communication skills to promote positive interactions while creating a learning environment that is beneficial to all.

How Effective is Your Leadership?

Level-Intermediate; DHR—CCPF/AM; CDA—5, 6; CKA—MA/PPD; CCDF—13; ASELD—NA; QRIS—NA

What are you doing as a leader to make sure that you are being effective? What characteristics make you an effective leader? Come learn more about who you are as a leader and how to be more effective in your role. If you have been in this role for any length of time, it is easy to forget why you do what you do. Now is the time to reignite that passion and center your focus on what makes you better.

Observations: Understanding the Whole Child

Intermediate; DHR- AM, CD; CDA- 7, 8; CKA- MA, CGD, COA; CCDF-13, 18; ASELD-APL; QRIS-1;

Early Childhood classrooms should reflect the interests, abilities, and needs of the children enrolled to support their learning. When staff members are consistently observing and planning with children, they create exciting and challenging environments. This training will present a brief background on the foundations of child development to support your understanding of observations which are essential to designing a quality environment.

Training for ALL Tracks

Training sessions offered this quarter:

Basics in Child Care

Being an early childhood educator requires you to be willing to wear many hats. As a new educator, remember that your job description may change on a daily basis. As an early childhood educator, you will be challenged to find new experiences to share with children. Basics in Child Care will guide educators through six fundamental areas of early childhood development to prepare them for caring for children, to be knowledgeable of child development, resourceful in planning activities, skilled in guiding behavior, and able to maintain healthy environments.

*To meet the requirements given for facilities participating in the Child Care Subsidy Program, we offer CCDF Areas together in 2 hour training sessions. CCDF 9 is available via our E-learning site. **Some sessions are available only every other quarter.***

CCDF Areas 1 & 3: Prevention & Control of Infectious Diseases/Administration of Medication

CCDF Areas 2 & 6: SIDS & Safe Sleep Practices/Shaken Baby Syndrome & Abusive Head Trauma

CCDF Areas 4 & 7: Emergencies Due to Food & Allergic Reactions/Emergency Preparedness

CCDF Areas 5 & 8: Building & Physical Premises Safety/Handling & Storage of Hazardous Materials

CCDF Areas 10 & 11: Child Abuse & Neglect/First Aid

What are you trying to tell me: All Behavior is a Form of Communication

BASIC; DHR-PDG; CDA-3,4; CKA-CGD; CCDF-20; ASELD-LLT; QRIS-1; Target Age Group—All
Young children often communicate their needs through behavior. In this training, participants will learn techniques to help them recognize and address common problems that result from misunderstanding the actions/behaviors of children in the classroom.

APT: Professionalism in the Early Childhood Setting

Basic; DHR—QCCL, CCPF; CDA-6; CKA-PPD; CCDF-20; ASELD-SED; QRIS-4 Target Age Group—All
In this training we will identify skills and characteristics of an early childhood education professional including the topics: Professionalism: Knowledge and skills, behaving like a professional in the early childhood field, and doing our best for children as a professional. Participants will gain a valuable perspective regarding the areas in which they most need to improve in order to meet their own professionalism goals.

It's OK to be Afraid

Intermediate; DHR—HSUP; CDA—1, 8; CKA—HSN/CGD; CCDF—13; ASELD—SED; QRIS—NA;
Do you have any fears that others do not understand? How does that make you feel? Just imagine what our children are feeling when we, the adults who should be compassionate, do not make them feel like their feelings matter. It is ok to be afraid and kids need to know that. They also need to know what to do when they are afraid. Learn ways to respond to children's fears and give them the tools they need to work through those fears.

3. Your camera is required to be on during virtual training sessions.

5. Children under the age of 16 are not allowed to attend or stay for training sessions, including on-site training sessions.

***Important Update Regarding Alabama Pathways**

On June 17, 2024, Alabama Pathways, also known as the Professional Development Registry (PDR) website went back online. All licensed facilities MUST register for classes through Alabama Pathways. Any certificates obtained from June 1, 2023 to now MUST be uploaded to Alabama Pathways. Child Care Central will no longer give printed certificates for trainings to licensed facilities. Certificates will be available on the PDR within 48 business hours of the training date.
